### NOTICE OF RACE

The Notation [DP] in a rule in the NoR means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

#### **1 RULES**

- 1.1 The championship will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The prescriptions of Irish Sailing will apply.
- 1.3 The Racing Rules changed are: Race Signals AP, 28.1, 32, 35, 60.1(b), 61, 61.3, 62.1(a), 62.2, A2, A4 & A5.  
The changes appear in full in the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.4 The International Flying Fifteen Class Rules will apply as modified by this Notice of Race.

#### **2 ADVERTISING**

Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the Organising Authority (OA).

#### **3 IDENTIFICATION**

Subject to the approval of the OA a boat chartered or loaned for the event may declare at the time of entry or registration a sail number which may be different from the registered number of the hull provided that the number declared shall not be the sail number of any other boat competing in the regatta (References RRS 77, Appendix G).

#### **4 ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY**

- 4.1 The championship is open to all boats of the International Flying Fifteen class whose helm or crew is a member of their National Class Association.
- 4.3 Eligible boats may enter by completing the online entry at <http://www.cayc.co.uk/events/flying-fifteen-eastern-championship/> prior to 12.00 on Friday 21 June.  
Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the OA in the Committee Room on Saturday 22 June.

## **5 FEES**

5.1 Entry fee £75 or €82.50 per boat.

5.2 Late entry fee of £10 or €12 to be paid at registration.

## **6 SCHEDULE**

6.1 Registration at CAYC Committee Room:

Friday 21 June 1900 - 2000

Saturday 22 June 0930 - 1100

6.2 Five races are scheduled, with three on Saturday and two on Sunday, subject to amendment.

6.3 Due to tidal constraints or weather dependencies one extra race may be sailed on the Saturday.

6.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race is 1230 on Saturday 22 June and 1300 on Sunday 23 June.

6.5 No warning signal will be made after 1600 on Sunday 23 June.

6.6 A briefing will be held in the General Room (1<sup>st</sup> floor) at 1115 on Saturday 22 June. (High Water on 22 June is 1530 & 23 June is 1617)

## **7 MEASUREMENTS**

Each boat shall have a valid class measurement certificate which must be available for inspection at the event.

## **8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS**

The sailing instructions will be available at registration or on [www.cayc.co.uk](http://www.cayc.co.uk)

## **9 THE COURSES**

The courses to be sailed will be a combination of Windward / Leeward with a Triangle or Windward / Leeward.

## **10 SCORING**

10.1 Two races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

10.2 When fewer than four races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. This changes RRS A2.

10.3 When four to five races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

10.4 Boats will all start together, but may be scored in Gold, Silver and Bronze divisions. The divisions will be advised by FFAI.

## **11 STORAGE**

Boats shall be kept on the hardstanding at CAYC. Local boats may be kept on their moorings.

## **12 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS**

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats in her class. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

## **13 PRIZES**

There will be prizes for Gold, Silver, Bronze and Classic fleets.

13.1 Prizes will be given as follows:

First, Second and Third Overall.

First in Silver Fleet.

First in Bronze Fleet.

13.2 Further prizes including prizes for the Classic fleet may be awarded at the discretion of the OA.

#### **14 RISK STATEMENT**

14.1 Rule 4 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone"

Sailing by its nature is an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- (b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (e) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (f) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

#### **15 INSURANCE**

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid and adequate third-party liability insurance in line with respective class requirements.

#### **16 MEDIA RIGHTS, CAMERAS AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT**

16.1 By participating in this event a competitor automatically grants to the organisers and its sponsors the right in perpetuity to make, use and show, from time to time at their discretion, any motion pictures and live, taped or filmed television and other reproductions of him or her during the period of the competition without compensation.
